Size 60" x 60" - Block size 6½" x 6½"



Requirements

A fat $\frac{1}{4}$ of each fabric 1 to 20

1. A50.1 - Safari drive on cream
2. A50.2 - Safari drive on green
3. A50.3 - Safari drive on light grey
4. A51.1 - Safari animals on orange
5. A51.2 - Safari animals on green
6. A51.3 - Safari animals on turquoise
7. A52.1 - Safari animals on cream
8. A52.2 - Safari animals on green
9. A52.3 - Safari animals on charcoal
10. A53.1 - Rainbow splash elephant on cream
11. A53.2 - Rainbow splash elephant on yellow
12. A53.3 - Rainbow splash elephant on pale blue
13. A54.1 – Animal print on cream
14. A54.2 – Animal print on earth
15. A54.3 – Animal print on light grey
16. BB24 - Rouge bumbleberries
17. BB26 - Turquoise bumbleberries
18. BB31 - New green bumbleberries
19. BB32 - Spring green bumbleberries
20. BB37 - Duck egg bumbleberries
21. White fabric 2m

Wadding and backing

$\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances are included in all cutting instructions. Press all seams open unless otherwise noted.

Cutting

From fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, 9, 12, and 14 cut
5 x 5" x 5"

From fabrics 5, 10, 11, 13, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 cut
10 x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ "

From fabric 21 cut

100 x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for block 1

100 x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for block 1

50 x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for block 2

100 x 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ " for block 2

Making




Block 1

Lay out your fabric pieces as shown in the diagram.

Sew a strip to either side of the centre square, and press back each time.

Join the top and bottom strip to complete the block.

You will need to make 50 of these in total.



Block 2

Lay out the fabric pieces as shown in the diagram.

Join a square to either side of one of the small strips, remembering to press back neatly each time.

Repeat the above process for the squares on the other side of the block.

Join these pieces to either side of the long strip to complete the block.

You need to make 50 of these in total.

Make up the quilt top

Lay out the blocks as in main diagram, and sewing them in rows. Pressing the seams in one way and then on the next row press them the other way, this helps to get the rows to mix when sewing them together.

When you have sewn all the blocks together you can then sandwich the quilt top, wadding and the backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired. The quilt shown was quilted with a curve pattern.

Trim off excess wadding and backing and square up the quilt ready for the binding.

Cut the binding strip from the fabric 21. Cutting 2½" strips sew together using diagonal seams making it long enough to go around the quilt. Sew this to your quilt and do not forget to add your label.
